

Why enroll in ACES?

PetDx understands that financial constraints can be a hurdle to achieving a conclusive diagnosis following a *Cancer Signal Detected* OncoK9 test result.

The ACES (Advanced Cancer Evaluation Support)
Program is intended to help ease the burden,
enabling pet owners to consent to their veterinarian's
recommended diagnostic workup, thereby supporting
veterinarians and their clients by facilitating access
to care.

PetDx will pay up to \$1,000 towards the cost of the dog's additional evaluation and diagnostic workup (the "Confirmatory Cancer Testing") that follow the Cancer Signal Detected OncoK9 Test Report.

Who is eligible?

All dogs without a prior cancer diagnosis who receive a Cancer Signal Detected OncoK9 test result.

How it works

- 1 Following a *Cancer Signal Detected* report, the veterinarian can obtain the pet owner's signed Program Agreement and establish eligibility for ACES by going to **oncok9.info/finap**.
- 2 After receipt of the Program Agreement by PetDx Customer Support, the veterinarian can work with their client to align on the proposed Confirmatory Cancer Evaluation.
- Once the workup is performed, the veterinarian will send the pet's medical record, including any laboratory or diagnostic test results to help@petdx.com.
- The clinic can then call (833) 464-7297 for payment over the phone.

Confirmatory Cancer Evaluation

A confirmatory cancer evaluation is recommended as the next step after a Cancer Signal Detected result is reported by OncoK9 and may include any or all of the following:



EXAM

- · Thorough clinical history
- · Thorough physical exam
 - Including oral and rectal exam



LABORATORY

- · CBC and Chemistry
- Urinalysis



IMAGING

- Thoracic radiographs 3 views
- Abdominal imaging ultrasound preferred
- Radiographs of localized areas of bone or joint pain, if present



SAMPLING

 Tissue sampling of any detected masses or enlarged lymph nodes for pathological analysis

In some cases, advanced imaging (such as CT and/or MRI) may be indicated.
